Effective June 2, 2021 the Catholic Bishops of Ohio have lifted the dispensation to attend Sunday Mass, except for those who are ill, have significant health risk factors, or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group gatherings. In response, the following changes will occur at our liturgical gatherings:

- Facemasks are no longer required. However, it is encouraged that those who are unvaccinated to continue to wear a facemask.
- Social distancing is no longer required. However, every other pew on the alley side of the church will remain roped off for those who choose to continue social distancing.
- Holy water will once again be in the font and at the doors of the church.
- Hymnals will be in the pews for the congregation to participate in the singing of the hymns and Mass parts!
- At Holy Communion, the distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended until further notice. It is highly encouraged that one receives Holy Communion in the hand, however, one has the right to receive on the tongue. If you choose to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, please wait until the end of the Communion line to receive.
- We will continue to use the Offertory boxes at the back of the church.
